Seedlings of hope planted for a greener future for Aruba

Fifty-five fifth-grade school children and their teachers of Mon Plaisir School in Oranjestad were joined by five Aruba Airport Authority employees and 30 Bucuti & Tara staff members for the special event. Four volunteers with <u>Ban Lanta y Planta</u>, Aruba's highly impactful reforestation nonprofit organization, prepared and guided the planting process.

The <u>spirited group</u> enjoyed getting hands-on as they dug holes and gently planted seedlings reflective of the school children's very point in life as they help grow Aruba's future. The 55 trees included Brasil (Haematoxylum brasiletto), Calbas (Crescentia cujete), Seida cora (Jatropha gossypifolia), Palisia blanco (Bursera karsteniana) and Palo di bonchi (Erythrina velutina).

Community pride and partnerships

Bucuti & Tara sponsored the water for the trees for the first three years for 2750AWG. They also provided sandwiches and fruits along with cold water in the resort's reusable water bottles for each child to have as a keepsake of the good they did for their island home on Earth Day.

Fofoti Tours & Transfers donated the transportation for the school children and teachers. Bucuti & Tara staff members carpooled to the nature preserve to lessen their carbon footprint.

The Bucuti Tara - GMC Nature Preserve

<u>The Bucuti Tara - GMC Nature Preserve</u> is located in the heart of Noord. Bucuti & Tara Beach Resort, Owner/CEO Ewald Biemans and island friend Greta Marie Case donated the 12-hectare/30-acre stretch of land in Oct. 2022 as a gift to Aruba. By forever saving this land from further development, the fragile ecosystem within it is starting to strengthen. Flora and fauna, including any of the more than 280 bird

species, are calling the preserve their safe haven. Nature paths will be added to the preserve for local residents and island visitors, alike, to have a peaceful spot to soak in Aruba's natural beauty while breathing in fresh air provided by the newly planted trees.

With the Earth Day 2024 tree planting, The Bucuti Tara - GMC Nature Preserve now has 735 indigenous trees planted. More than 1,000 seedlings are being prepared in the greenhouse as the Phase 1 reforesting initiative continues. Ultimately, the nature preserve is being reforested with 15,000 native trees. Researchers and students with the University of Aruba are partnering with the nature preserve to study the emissions drawdown capability of each indigenous species of tree. Doubling as a carbon sink, once completely reforested and matured, the nature preserve will draw down an estimated 375 tCO2 emissions annually from the atmosphere.
